

Residential Advocate

REACH Beyond Domestic Violence is a non-profit organization providing safety and support to survivors of abuse while engaging communities to promote healthy relationships and prevent domestic violence. Our programs include 24-hour hotline services, emergency shelter, support groups, legal advocacy, specialized children's services, community-based survivor advocacy programs and community education and training. Each year, REACH works with over 6,000 people in our 27 community service area and beyond.

REACH seeks to end domestic violence in families, communities and society. Our leadership in community building, education and prevention programs and providing trauma-informed services drive our work and continued growth.

Residential Advocate - General Description

Residential Advocates work in our 8 family emergency shelter with survivors of domestic violence and their children. In addition to advocacy services, they also support the shelter milieu and are responsible for crisis intervention and conflict management. Residential Advocates report to the Residential Program Director.

Responsibilities:

Direct Service/Advocacy

- Complete intakes and assessments
- Serve as advocate for survivors and their families to address needs including but not limited to housing, benefits, medical, childcare, legal, education and employment
- Provide safety planning and information about domestic violence resources to shelter guests
- Attend appointments with survivors as appropriate
- Facilitate house meetings and support groups
- Responsible for milieu management and crisis intervention
- Support with shelter operations and facilities maintenance
- Answer hotline calls
- Develop and maintain liaisons with housing agencies and other community resources
- Engage in shelter practices and policies consistent with REACH's model (for information about our approach to supporting survivors in shelter, please see ["How the Earth Didn't Fly into the Sun"](#) a publication of the Missouri Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual Violence.)

Administrative

- Maintain survivors' paperwork including housing applications and other needed documentation
- Attend trainings that are relevant to direct service advocacy and will enhance the residential program
- Provide trainings internally and externally
- Complete program reports and follow data collection procedures
- Support and train other residential staff members, volunteers and interns

Other Responsibilities

- Participate in clinical supervision
- Provide regular backup/on-call support
- Attend events and support programming throughout the agency
- All other duties as assigned by the Director of Residential Programs

Work Schedule

Residential Advocate

- This is a salaried non-exempt position on a fluctuating workweek.
- 40 hours per week, Monday through Friday daytime hours.
- Daytime flexibility to accommodate resident's appointments and shelter coverage is required.
- Occasional evening, weekend, and holiday coverage will be necessary including coverage during inclement weather.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent human services experience
- A car for transporting survivors
- Bilingual candidates preferred

The salary for this position ranges from low to mid \$40s depending upon skills and experience.
