About REACH

For more than 45 years, REACH Beyond Domestic Violence has stood alongside survivors, families, and communities, responding to domestic violence with compassion, courage, and resolve.

Founded in 1981 as the Waltham Battered Women's Support Committee, REACH began as an all-volunteer shelter and hotline created to fill a critical gap in services for survivors of abuse. Over four decades later, REACH has evolved into a dynamic, multiservice, trauma-informed organization serving 27 communities north and west of Boston and reaching more than 7,000 individuals annually.

Today, REACH provides a full continuum of survivor-centered services including:

- 24/7 crisis support
- Emergency shelter
- Community advocacy
- Housing support and stabilization
- Children's services
- Clinical support groups
- Prevention education
- Community engagement
- Systems advocacy

Every service we provide is grounded in survivor voice, dignity, self-determination, and our unwavering commitment to providing safety and compassionate care.

Impact Statistics

- During FY26, REACH collaborated with 32 community partners (including schools, libraries, healthcare organizations, and statewide coalitions) to host over 100 prevention and education activities for professional and academic audiences.
- During FY26, REACH provided over 800 hours of clinical support for child survivors along with group support for their parents.
- During FY26, REACH's community advocacy and shelter teams provided over 2,300 hours of direct services such as safety planning, legal advocacy, probate court accompaniment, and housing assistance.
- During FY26, REACH's prevention team hosted healthy relationship workshops and trainings for over 1,200 youth and adult participants. Some of our youth workshops include 'Healthy Relationships 101' and 'Boundaries and Consent,' while trainings include topics such as 'DV 101' and 'Creating Trauma Informed Spaces.'

"I came to REACH because I was ready to start healing. I am so thankful they answered my call that day. I was still terrified, but my advocate's calmness and reassurance helped me realize I was in a safe space, and that she would do anything she could to help me. I felt I had a friend, someone who finally got it. I felt seen and heard by her."

"Not only has REACH given me support, it has helped me find my voice as a survivor. To find empowerment through advocating for better laws. So families who come after mine don't have to battle to retain their freedom."

"When I found REACH, I found another level of support beyond my family and friends. It wasn't just helping with court paperwork or navigating systems. It was someone sitting beside me in court when my hands were shaking. It was someone reminding me how strong I am and how much I've already

overcome. And it was the sisterhood I found through REACH — women who lifted me up and helped me feel empowered again.”
